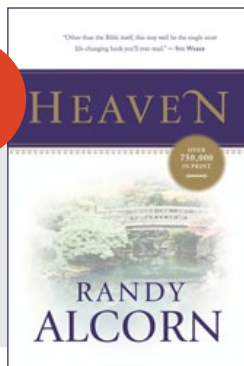

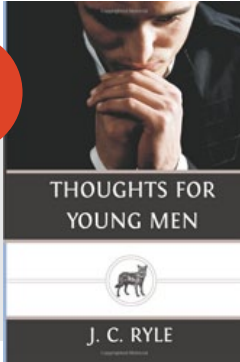
DAVID BY WALTER CHANTRY

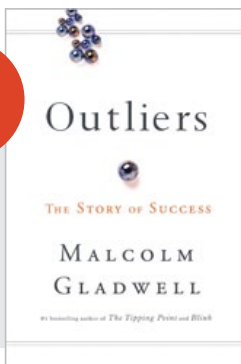

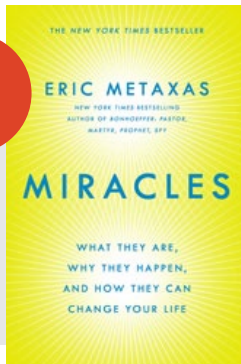


OUTLIERS BY MALCOLM GLADWELL

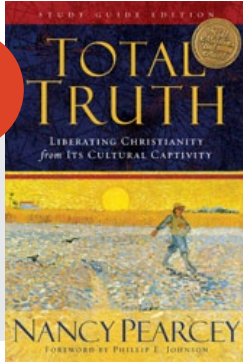
JUST DO SOMETHING BY KEVIN DEYOUNG

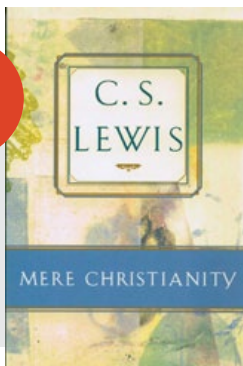


TOTAL TRUTH BY NANCY PEARCEY

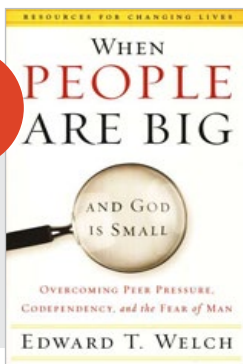

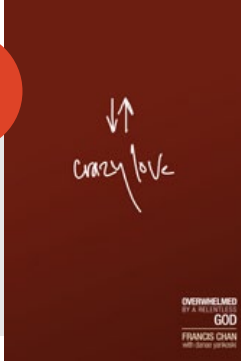

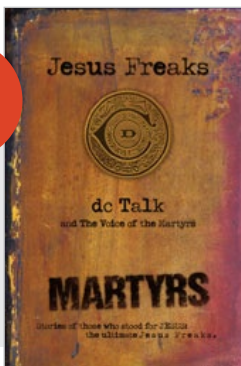


CRAZY LOVE BY FRANCIS CHAN

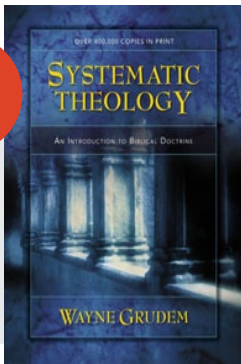


JESUS FREAKS BY DC TALK & THE VOICE OF THE MARTYRS

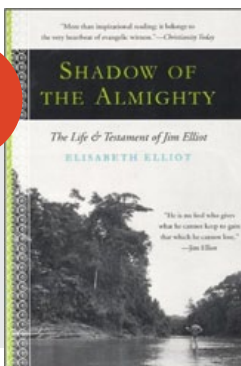


SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY BY WAYNE GRUDEM

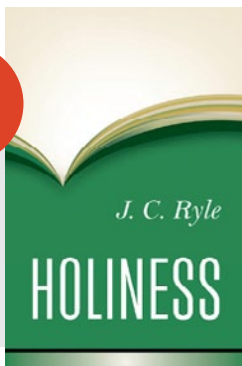


BE THE CHANGE BY ZACH HUNTER

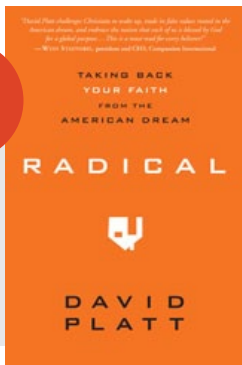


HOLINESS BY J.C. RYLE

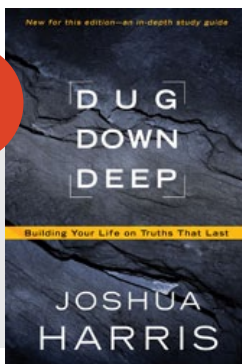


RADICAL BY DAVID PLATT
